

£139,340 LOTTO WIN!

A Virtual World Direct e-Lottery syndicate is still celebrating – four weeks after scooping a £139,340.00 win in the UK Lotto Wednesday main draw.

The syndicate matched four main numbers and the bonus ball to give the 49 members a welcome windfall of £2,843.67 each.

It was e-Lottery's biggest win since its launch last April. And, as if that wasn't enough, the same syndicate collected two ball wins the previous Saturday and following Saturday.

VWD founder Tom Brodie said: 'This is a tremendous boost, the beginning of notable success. e-Lottery is definitely making an impact!'

The UK Lotto operator organised TV and press coverage to mark the presentation of the big cheque.

A Lotto Winners

Lucky Len Fitzgerald bagged £140,000 on the Lotto - then had to give most of it away. Len who heads one of Britain's biggest Lotto syndicates, was celebrating when five numbers and the bonus ball came up. But there are 49 members in the group, and he ran up a huge phone bill calling them all to say they had each won £2,844.49. Len 45, of Colwyn Bay, North Wales, said: 'I know we've not won much cash each, but it'll certainly come in very handy.' Camelot, who run Lotto, said the syndicate was one of the biggest they had come across



WINNING nearly £140,000 on the Lotto doesn't sound so great when you realise you are one of 49 supposed winners!

But that's what happened to one syndicate based in Colwyn Bay which assigned £139,980 when it matched five numbers, plus the bonus ball, only in the August 28 draw.

And to further boost the prize, the syndicate also matched a further three and four numbers on separate lines several times over!

Each member can pocket £2,844.49.

Syndicate leader Leonard Fitzgerald, 48, had the mammoth task of phoning the other 48 members, who come from all over Britain, from Scotland to the south of England, to tell them the fantastic news.

'It's not a huge amount of money per person, but we've all got something worthwhile to spend the money on, mostly home improvements such as carpets and curtains and paving,' said Mr Fitzgerald.

The winning ticket was purchased from Gay's newsagents in Colwyn Bay, but it isn't the first time there has been a big winner at the store - five years ago, a Lotto player swapped £200,000 after watching the numbers and the bonus ball.

'For a lot of the members, the win couldn't have come at a better time,' said Tom Brodie.

'One is getting married, another moving house and someone else needs to pay a large bill on a car,' said Tom Brodie, from Rhyd-y-Fael.

'I am, however, planning to use my winnings for a holiday.'

This isn't the first time the group has won, but previous wins were quite small and got back into the syndicate.

Mr Brodie, who runs an internet business, was one of the founders of the syndicate and encouraged some of his friends and colleagues to join.

The syndicate has been playing for five months and will continue to play every Wednesday and Saturday.

And Leonard insists the win will not change his life!
